Three Ways Your Smoking Is Affecting Your Loved Ones

One reason why millions of people quit smoking tobacco is to stop, prevent or limit the effects it has on loved ones. Secondhand smoke is the inhalation of burning tobacco products – such as cigarettes, cigars or pipes.



Secondhand smoke poses health risks, especially to those who already have a vulnerable immune system or those who live in the same household.

- Increased risk of illness – Those who are exposed to secondhand smoke are at an increased risk for lung cancer, heart disease and even stroke. Indirect exposure to tobacco smoke can also cause certain types of cancer in cats and dogs, and other pets, including lung and nose cancer.
- Chronic illness trigger – Secondhand smoke can cause and trigger severe asthma, respiratory infections and ear infections, especially with infants and children.
- Lingering smoke odors – Tobacco residue settles on hair, clothing, furniture, and other surfaces, creating odor and residue that is hard to remove. This is called thirdhand smoke. Tobacco residue is considered harmful to those exposed in homes, cars, and workplaces.

- proper chlorine and pH levels
- equipment safety
- lifeguard compliance
- first aid and emergency equipment accessibility

Our team works diligently to reduce the risk of waterborne illness and prevent injuries.

We are also excited to highlight the addition of our newest Environmental Health team member, Elisha, who has been instrumental in supporting pool inspections and regulatory enforcement efforts. Her contributions have strengthened our ability to respond promptly to concerns, conduct thorough inspections, and provide education to pool operators on maintaining compliance.

Our newest team member Elisha is scheduled to attend a Certified Pool Operators training in Lexington on April 9-10th.

As we look ahead to warmer weather, public pool safety remains a top priority for our Bullitt County Health Department: Environmental Health Division. Near the end of May, our focus will begin to shift to outdoor pools for the beginning of pool season.

Routine inspections, water quality monitoring, and enforcement of state and local regulations help ensure that community pools remain safe, clean, and enjoyable for everyone.


